

HOW TO MAKE A 4" QUILT SLEEVE

1. Cut a strip of fabric the width of the quilt x 9". (Your quilt shows better if the sleeve coordinates with the quilt back.




2. Using a ½" seam, make a tube, sewing the length of the strip, right sides together.




3. Turn under and finish edges of tube (raw edges look sloppy).




- 4. Turn right side out, press flat on one side.
- 5. Baste ½" from pressed side.
- 6. Adjust sleeve so that basted fold is showing, press flat.



7. Pin top of sleeve 1" from top of quilt. Pin bottom of sleeve so that it lies flat. Blindstitch into place.





8. Remove basting, leaving room for a rod to be inserted and for the quilt to hang flat. If the sleeve is stitched flat to the quilt, the quilt will pucker and strain when hung.
